Literacy and Language

Writing

- Creating poems including Scottish poetry
- Imaginative writing based on their learning of the Scottish Wars of Independence

Reading

- Work in reading groups to develop understanding of underlying ideas in the text.
- Practise reading with fluency and expression by learning common words and using decoding strategies such as sounding out etc.
- To develop Book Detectives skills to enhance reading comprehension, questioning and discussion around reading book.
- Develop reading skills using a variety of genre.

Handwriting

- Continue to practise joining letters correctly, with some using more formal cursive script where appropriate.

Listening and Talking

- Explore the variety of roles required for effective group discussion, taking on roles such as group leader, secretary etc.
- Prepare and recite a Scottish poem as part of our Scottish celebration.

French

- Continue to learn numbers up to 100.
- Develop French conversation to include information about likes and dislikes (activities etc.)
- Introduce giving and receiving directions.

Numeracy & Mathematics

- Learning about fractions and decimals using practical materials.
- Continue to practise quick recall of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division facts through Basic Facts games and activities.
- Using digital and analogue clock to tell time.
- Calculate durations of time.
- Use timetables in practical activities.

Problem Solving

- Develop skills and awareness of mathematical language when solving multi-step word problems.
- Consider which strategy is best to use to solve a problem.

Health & Wellbeing

- Developing interpersonal skills by considering verbal and non-verbal language.

P.E.

- Develop passing and dribbling skills in hockey.
- Continue to develop striking and scoring skills.
- Work effectively as part of a team.

RME

- Further develop understanding of the Christian celebration of Easter.
- Explore the important symbols/traditions surrounding Easter.
- Compare and contrast this with another country's celebrations.

ICT/Technologies

- Using SEESAW to upload, edit and document pupils' own learning experiences.
- To develop and demonstrate an understanding of responsible behaviour when accessing online activities, search engines, games.
- Create a stop motion animation related to the class IDL topic.

Expressive Arts

Drama/Dance

- Create a short creative dance to represent events during the Scottish wars of independence.

Art

- Design and create a modern version of a Scottish and English soldier ready for battle.
- Create observed drawings of key historical places.

Music

- Learn and perform some Scottish songs

Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL)

- * Scottish Wars of Independence.
- Create timelines and order events chronologically.
- Research key historical figures in groups and teach the rest of the class about them.
- Identify and explain significant events in battles
- Describe and compare the weapons and clothing worn by soldiers.
- Explain how the outcomes of these events have affected Scottish society.
- Compare how independence is being sought now compared to in the past.
